I see a responsibility as a new Catholic. My point of A VIEW FROM THE PEW: conversion is still fresh and I feel it's valuable to others. Perhaps my example can bring hope to those who pray for loved ones to come to the church. Previously, I was quite anti-Catholic; my secular misconceptions and the tragic scandals had made me deeply suspicious of the church. Other religious experiences left me cold so I drifted through a complex and confusing life without God. I was eventually beaten down to the point where I sought the divine in desperation. It started with calling out to angels for help - I felt their reassurance and support. Then, one day, as I walked past the church near my home, there was a fleeting moment where I was offered a choice to continue on my way or to deviate from my path and walk up to the imposing door. I heeded this whisper from God, turned the handle and entered the stillness. I felt an immediate peace as I walked down the aisle. I sat there in the quiet and wept because I realised I'd found something sacred at last. I didn't know anything about this church, only that it was very different to anywhere else I'd been. When I discovered it was Catholic, I had to face my misconceptions and seek the truth - that this is the original church of Jesus Christ and that much of my knowledge of the church was wrong. From this point, my life changed for the better. Things that I struggled with were taken from me overnight, confirming my new faith. I found a peace and clarity with key decisions that lifted me up. This culminated in our journey to Fleetwood and the discovery of this wonderful parish, a miracle in itself. I've seen the necessity of a crisis to break down barriers and clear a way through to God. I've noticed that when I stumble it's because I've tried to do too much alone rather than trusting and reaching for God. Ultimately, life is so much easier and richer with Jesus.
