Trained as a psychologist he developed an interest in the overlapping areas of Psychology and Possession. (Heavy stuff but his experiences and insights are full of things which inspire faith). He is very devoted to Our Lady and has set up a Holy Order of like-minded priests and exorcists called The Dolorans in the desert of Nevada. They train and instruct other priests interested in entering the field of exorcism across the USA. He also gives very interesting lectures on Our Lady, on traditional Catholic teaching and where we are currently with regard to spiritual warfare in these turbulent and wicked times and how to lead holier lives.

Don't be put off by the dark nature of this subject. It really is a great guide to faith and to the ultimate victory of The Immaculate Heart vis a viz the Fatima Message. He also dispels all the sensationalism of Hollywood regarding this kind of work, whilst making us realize the scope and intensity of the spiritual battles currently raging and giving us the prayer tools to lead holier lives.
