

I'm delighted that we are now a member of the Baby Loss Awareness Alliance, which is made up of over 100 UK charities working in the maternal support sector helping those affected by pregnancy and baby loss. Now in its 19th year, Baby Loss Awareness Week aims to raise awareness of the key issues around pregnancy and baby loss in the UK. Throughout the week, bereaved parents, their families, and their friends unite to commemorate the lives of babies who died during pregnancy, at or soon after birth and in infancy. <u>Water Shortage</u>: Quite ironic that in the wettest few days we've had for some time, we have received a note from United Utilities asking us to do all we can to save water at this time. Our water comes from reservoirs in the Lake District which are only 36% full, instead of the more usual 70%. This is because it has been the driest June to September in over 130 years in the Lake District. By re-using water where we can, using our washing machines less and showering instead of having a bath, we can help our reservoirs to recover as the weather gets wetter.

What can I do? It's really easy to save water with very little impact on our daily routine. Only use what you need and follow these simple tips to save at least 12 litres*:

- 1. Turn off the tap when you brush your teeth save 24 litres a day
- 2. Spend one minute less in the shower save 12 litres
- 3. Skip just one washing machine load save 50 litres
- 4. Fix a leaky loo go to <u>Get Water Fit</u> and order your leaky loo tester strip save up to 400 litres a day
- 5. *12 litres is equivalent to: 48 brews; around 21 pints; or 2 extra toilet flushes!
