

<u>Hallowe'en:</u> Tom Birch from the United Reformed Church has written a nice little piece to remind us of what Hallowe'en really means:-

Hallowe'en, October  $31^{st}$ , is probably the most widely misunderstood and misrepresented day in the festival year. So many now believe that it was a pagan festival that this belief is virtually impossible to shake. The facts, however, are very different. Hallowe'en means the Eve of Hallow-tide (November  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$ ) but it is a Christian festival. The festival known in English as All-Hallows or Hallow-mas ('hallow' from the Old English word for 'holy man' or 'saint'), was instituted to commemorate all Christian saints and martyrs, known and unknown, who had been instrumental in forming and perpetuating the faith. The feast of All Souls was created to commemorate the faithful departed who had gone before and in whose footsteps we follow.

The day will offer teaching and training in the gift of prophecy, word of knowledge and word of wisdom.
