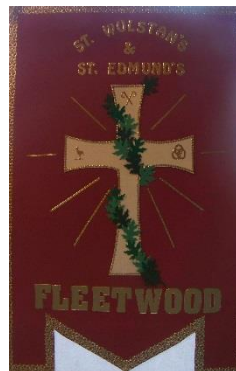
Basket collections for goods:
