
We believe that it is you who guides the course of human history and that your love can change our destiny for the better, whatever our human condition may be.

<u>Sunday Mass:</u> As mentioned at our televised Mass last Sunday, from this Sunday we will once again be celebrating Mass in St Wulstan's at 1000. Mass will continue to be televised at the same time for those unable to, or not yet ready to, return to a publicly celebrated Mass. We are acutely aware that the Covid crisis is not yet over, and is unlikely to be, until a vaccine is found. For that reason we have taken a very cautionary and gradual approach to getting back to 'Normal' by distributing Mass times throughout the week, allowing more people to come than could have been fitted in on a Sunday. Hopefully, until things do return to normal, some people will still attend Mass on their chosen weekday, in order to share the opportunities available for Mass.

<u>Updated Covid 19 Guidelines:</u> The government now requires that, unless they have a medical exemption, those attending places of worship wear face coverings from 8th August. Readers may temporarily remove face coverings whilst reading at the lectern. When distributing the Sacred Host, the priest **must** wear a face covering and carefully sanitise his hands before and after distribution. Even with these arrangements in place, Communion time is a moment when the minister is in close proximity to a significant number of persons. For this reason, the Sacred Host is to be carefully and respectfully placed or 'dropped' into each communicant's hands in such a way as to avoid any hand-to-hand contact.

<u>Supporting People back into work:</u> Some helpful details from The LEP Rep at a leadership Forum meting I attended last Thursday:

New microsite launched: www.skillsforwork.info - designed to support individuals who are currently furloughed, facing redundancy, or looking for work - bringing together offers from local providers as well as some of the new initiatives such as the DofE Skills Toolkit.

Escalate online tool https://www.lancashireskillshub.co.uk/escalate-form/ is a simple tool to help people find local programmes to get into work. A short 30 min online training session.

Lancashire County now has a Task Force for redundancy in place. The aim is to get into companies as soon as redundancies are announced.

Job opportunities are available in certain sectors such as health & social care, food & drink and retail and there's a current demand for I.T. skills, for those willing to re-train. Need to promote this message and myth bust 'there are no jobs'.

Missing Teenager: All Catholic churches have received an appeal from the Metropolitan Police to find a 15yr old from Morecambe who has gone missing. A poster is on both our church notice boards. She has no money, clothing, phone or contact with family. She could be anywhere in the UK as she said she does not wish to be found. Her name is Sophie Odere, but uses other names. She looks older than she is. She used to attend church and go to a Catholic school.
