

<u>Lockdown 3 - A message from Bishop Paul:</u> Along with the latest information from the Hierarchy on the new restrictions, Bishop Paul has also written to the priests of the Diocese, (gently reminding us, I'm sure, that the Grace of Orders does not make us immune to Covid). What he writes, of course, applies to all of us:

"In the light of the new variant of the virus, which is more transmissible, I cannot stress enough the need for all of us to strictly adhere to the rules, and to ensure best hygiene practice in our churches at all times. If you feel unwell, and especially if you are displaying any symptoms of Covid-19, please do not attempt to lead any church services. You may also have noticed that 'shielding' is being re-introduced for the most clinically vulnerable. If you fall into this category, please take appropriate steps to protect yourself. In the spirit of the 'lockdown' rules, I would suggest that only pastoral visits which are absolutely essential are made at this time".

Peace Sunday 17th January:

Pax Christi recently launched the Catholic Nonviolence

Initiative, which asks people to - "Carry out in my life the love and example of Jesus: by striving for peace within myself and seeking to be a peacemaker in my daily life; by refusing to retaliate in the face of provocation; be persevering in nonviolence of tongue and heart; by living simply and conscientiously so that I do not deprive others of the means to live; by actively resisting evil and working non-violently to abolish war from my own heart and from the face of the earth."

<u>Christian Unity Week 18-25th January:</u> It is truly wonderful and a great blessing to see how the various Christian churches work well, and get on well, together here in Fleetwood. This annual week of prayer for unity reminds us that it is the will and prayer of Christ that we may all be one. Pope Francis, in his recent letter to the world entitled Fratelli Tutti, (on fraternity and social friendship) has given us this prayer which we could all perhaps pray during the Octave:

"O God, Trinity of Love, from the profound communion of your divine life, pour out upon us a torrent of fraternal love. Grants us the love reflected in the actions of Jesus, in his family at Nazareth, and in the early Christian community.

Grant that we Christians may live the Gospel, discovering Christ in each human being, recognising him crucified in the sufferings of the abandoned and forgotten of our world, and risen in each brother and sister who makes a new start".
