Nativity Sets, Advent Calendars, Catholic Diaries, Christmas Cards, and gifts.



PS from Brian Wood: In 1976, Cardinal Josef Mindszenty visited the Hungarian community in the North West. He celebrated Holy Mass at Salford Cathedral. He had been tortured and imprisoned for many years by the communists in Budapest and, after sheltering for several more years in the US Embassy, he made it to the West. He devoted himself to caring for Hungarian exiles throughout the world. The Cathedral was packed for the Mass. As soon as he set foot in the aisle, the clapping and cheering started and stopped only when he reached the altar. At the end of Mass, when he turned to leave the altar, the clapping and cheering started again and stopped only when he had left the Great Door. Many people were in tears, me included. We knew we were in the presence of a saint. He has recently been declared Venerable, so he is on his way! Dear Jesus, give me the strength and inspiration to cling to my faith, especially when times are hard.
