During the war, my father was in the army. As D-day approached, they all had to have their injections, so a medical team arrived. They set up two tables with a doctor at each and soon two long queues formed. My dad noticed that all the men in the left-hand queue were shouting out in pain whereas the right-hand queue were peaceful and silent. He joined the right-hand queue and when his turn came he felt nothing. Afterwards, when the medics were packing up, he asked the doctor who had injected him why the other queue were all in pain and his queue wasn't. The doctor said "Well actually I'm a vet, and if I hurt my patients, they bite me." Dear Jesus, give strength and health to all in the NHS. They really must be approaching exhaustion.

We've all had the experience of yet another difficult year in the life of our parish, but, somehow, we've muddled through quite well, all things considered, and may have to for a bit longer yet. Thanks to all who have supported the parish so well, especially the many people involved in making the Mass available through stewarding, sacristan ministry, altar serving, reading, broadcasting, decorating, etc, and for our wonderful Eucharistic Ministers who take the Bread of Life to our sick and housebound every week. Lots of other good stuff goes on, largely unseen, by parishioners, such as our House Prayer Groups, maintenance of our property, and what we do outside the parish for the community in general. As a family, we've a lot to be thankful for. My firm heartfelt prayer for the new Year is that more of our young families will make their way back to join us. We miss them, and, let's face it, without them, we have no future.

Thoughts about St Edmund's Future: As promised, there will be a meeting in the Green Hut from 1800-1900, (just before Choir Practice) this Wednesday, 5th January, to discuss what parishioners think should happen to St Edmund's church building. I will stress again that no decisions whatever have been taken, but in an ever-changing Church and demographic, it's important that we come up with our own ideas, rather than have a solution imposed from the Diocese. We hope that as many as possible attend this meeting.
