

CHANGE OF MASS TIMES: As mentioned last Sunday, after Easter we will be changing some of our Mass times to reflect the change in pastoral cover for Fleetwood, following Fr Michael's current state of ill health. Thank you to those – not many – who let me know what they felt about the proposed times for Sundays. Most were quite happy with what St Mary's had proposed, ie 0900 St Mary's 1030 here. #### LATEST NEWS FROM STEPHEN BAMBER:

Dear friends,

Greetings from Rome on this Laetare Sunday. I cannot believe Holy Week and the Triduum are almost upon us - this year seems to have disappeared in a flurry of exams, retreats, and new academic modules.

We are well into the second semester here at the Beda. I am currently taking courses on Moral Theology, Psalms and Wisdom Literature, Human Development and Mediaeval Church History (to name a few). I have settled into the routine of seminary life quite well – although that is not to say it is easy.

I am kept quite busy in my role as Assistant M.C., and I am soon starting some outreach in our local parish of St. Leonardo Murialdo (cofounder of the Congregation of St. Joseph). I'll be teaching English along with a few other seminarians to anyone who wishes to learn: it's a big parish encompassing Roma Tre University, so Fr. Carmelo, the P.P. is confident that it will be a success: we will have to wait and see if his confidence is well founded!

On the Friday before Palm Sunday I will be instituted as an acolyte here in the college along with my fellow second year students. It's a significant step - the next ministerial staging post on my formation journey. I am looking forward to this occasion a great deal, as once we are instituted as Acolytes, we take on more of an active role in the liturgical life of the college.

I miss St. Wulstan's and the good people of Fleetwood a great deal. I will be sure to pop over for Mass during the Summer. Please remember me in your prayers and be assured of my own prayers for you and all your loved ones.

PS FROM BRIAN WOOD: In the mid-80s I worked very near Piccadilly Station in Manchester and occasionally I went to the station to watch the trains. On one occasion, the call went out "Engineer to Platform Five." I went along to see what was happening. He was sweeping the platform and was pushing his dustbin cart in front of him. The little man carried on sweeping. I stayed. Fully half an hour later, the suits looked at the switch and one of them moved the switch to the up position. The locomotive roared into life! The little sweeper had been right all along! Victory to the workers! Dear Jesus, Please look after all the people who work to keep the world moving round, especially when their input is not always appreciated.
