<p>THIS WEEK WE CELEBRATE THE MEMORIALS OF ST THOMAS AQUINAS & ST JOHN BOSCO</p> <p>ST THOMAS AQUINAS: A very intelligent man who studied at the University of Naples where he met John of St. Julian a Dominican preacher, who influenced him to join the recently founded Dominican Order much to the chagrin of his family who kidnapped him and unsuccessfully tried to persuade him not to join the order. Thomas was quiet and seldom spoke at the university, leading other students to believe he was mentally delayed, but Magnus prophetically said, "You call him the dumb ox, but in his teaching, he will one day produce such a bellowing that it will be heard throughout the world." Thomas is now celebrated as one of the most influential Doctors of the Church</p> <p>ST JOHN BOSCO: An Italian priest remembered for his work with the poor and abandoned children of Turin. He achieved a local reputation as a popular and eloquent preacher and was known to use the magic tricks he had learned as a boy to get a crowd's attention. With the help of companions, he set up many schools to help the disadvantaged children. He also founded the Salesian Order which is now worldwide using his "Preventive System" of reason, religion, and loving kindness.</p>
